“Let Us Celebrate”

Isaiah celebrated almost 3,000 years ago with these words, “For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counselor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace” (Is. 9:6).

Isaiah never beheld the Messiah with his natural eyes but viewed him with great joy by faith. Isaiah spoke the Word by the Spirit, and this Word was held in the womb of time until Gabriel would be sent to Mary. Once again the Word is spoken over Mary, and she quickly responds, “...be it unto me according to thy words” (Lk. 1:38). Mary becomes pregnant with this Word, Jesus (Jn. 1:1, 14).

Elisabeth later hears the greeting of Mary, and the babe, John, in her womb leaps. Elisabeth is filled with the Holy Ghost. She cries out with a loud cry, “Blessed (favored of God) above all other women are you! And blessed (favored of God) is the Fruit of your womb!...And blessed (happy, to be envied) is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of the things that were spoken to her from the Lord” (Lk. 1:41-45, Amp.).

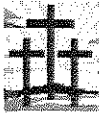
Mary responds in celebration over the Word, “My soul magnifies and extols the Lord, and my spirit rejoices, in God my Savior. For he hath regarded the low estate of his handmaiden: for, behold, from henceforth all generations shall call me blessed. For he that is mighty hath done to me great things; and holy is his name” (Lk. 1:46-55). We see (only to name a few) Isaiah, Elisabeth, and Mary celebrating! Throughout the Old Testament, the coming Messiah is celebrated. Every sacrifice since Adam, even the feasts held for thousands of years represented this Lamb of God, Jesus.

Well, Jesus came that Christmas morning, and the angels celebrated His birth. The shepherds heard the announcement of His birth, and they, too, celebrated. Three years later the kings would come and celebrate this King of Kings and Lord of Lords. His life was celebrated while He lived on earth. His resurrection from the dead was celebrated. His sending His Spirit on the day of Pentecost was celebrated. The manifestation of the Presence of Jesus is celebrated as the lost are born again, the sick are healed, the bound are delivered, and the broken in spirit are made whole.

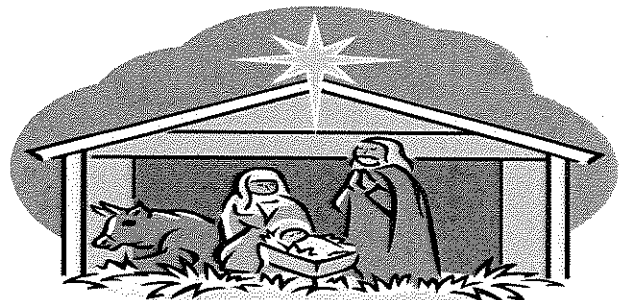
